## Dear Parents,

Again I need to start with a big thank you to all who made the Annual Spaghetti Supper another success. The committee and the volunteers ensured all who came had a great meal with super company!

By now you should have submitted the number of letters you need for Race for Education. Remember unless you opted out of fundraising you are required to submit a minimum of 10 letters if you only have one child at SUS or a minimum of 20 letters if you have 2 or more children attending SUS.

It has been noticed that a number of parents' Virtus approvals have expired. Approval is only for 5 years. You may have received an email asking you to complete the application process again. If you have any questions, please call Miss Laurie in the school office (410-665-3533).

Drop off in the morning has had a few close calls lately. Please, even if you drop off in front of the gym, continue to follow the drive pattern and not to pull out or make a U-turn. In mid-September the Cultural Diversity Committee will be holding a *World Fest @ SUS*. This will be a family evening where we will learn and celebrate the diversity of our SUS families. To make this a success the committee is looking for volunteers who will man a table focused on their own culture. For example, if your heritage is Irish, you would create a display around Ireland or if you are Jamaican you would set up a table about Jamaica. The IOWA and CogAt assessments are occurring this month. All students in grades 2 through 8 will be assessed. Grades 3, 5, 7, and 8 will be assessed in reading, written language, math, science, and social studies. Grades 2, 4, and 6 will be assessed in reading, written language, math and take an abilities component. The dates of the testing are March 23 through 27. Please do not make any appointments on these days. If it is an emergency, the test sessions

should be over by 12:30. Also make sure your child is on time, has had a good breakfast, and has two #2 sharpened pencils. All of these add up to a successful testing experience for your child.

Finally, although we are just starting March, April is right around the corner. Remember this year our spring break is different than in previous years.
