Saint John of the Cross



- "Saint for the Week": Saint John of the Cross was born in 1542 as Juan de Yepes, the Castilian son of a poor silk weaver in Toledo, Spain. Juan's early life was difficult. Soon after he was born, his father died and the family was left in the direct of poverty. After challenging years during the early part of his life, Juan would eventually offer himself as a lay-brother to the Carmelite friars. Who however, knowing his talents, had him ordained priest. During the early years of his priesthood, Juan befriended another future saint – Teresa of Avila. When Juan was tempted to change from the Carmelite order to the more strict religious Carthusian Order, it was Teresa who convinced him to stay and reform his own order. It was this decision to reform that would inspire his life's work to refocus the mission of the Catholic Church. His reform, though initially approved by his religious superior, was rejected by the elder friars, who condemned the future saint as a fugitive and cast him into prison. As a result of his deep connection to the sufferings of Christ, Juan de Yepes would become to be known as John the Cross. While in prison, John the Cross would write for hours each day as he developed into a great contemplative and spiritual writer. In 1926 he would be proclaimed a Doctor of the Church. He serves as the patron saint of contemplative life, mystics, and Spanish poets and his feast day is December 14.
