- <u>"Saint for the Week"</u>: <u>Saint Josephine Bakhita</u>. Josephine Bakhita was born in Sudan in 1869. Like her sister before her, Bakhita was kidnapped and sold into slavery as a young girl. Josephine was sold five different times to cruel masters. Her last sale was to an Italian merchant, Augusto Michieli, who brought her to Italy to be his daughter's nanny. While at the Michieli estate, Bakhita was given a silver crucifix, her first encounter with Christ. While in Venice, Josephine accompanied Michieli's daughter to a school run by the Canossian sisters. It was here that she fell in love with the Catholic faith. When Michieli had to move back to Africa, Bakhita refused to leave Italy. The Canossian sisters took her case to court where she was declared a free woman. Josephine would become a Canossian Daughter of Charity in 1896 and would faithfully serve her religious ministry for the next 50 years. Her feast day is February 8 and she is the patroness of Sudan and the victims of human trafficking.

UPDATES & REMINDERS

- **<u>Black History Month</u>**: As we celebrate *Black History Month*, we honor the innovators and inventors who changed the world in ways we may not have previously known. Accordingly, during our daily community prayer and announcement time, we honor those whose work life for others have made a lasting impact in our world. This week we learned about the following group of gifted Americans:
 - **Dr. George Carruthers** George is credited with the patent for the invention of the far ultraviolet camera/spectrograph in 1969. It was plated in gold and carried aboard the Apollo 16 mission, where it was placed on the moon's surface. The camera used ultraviolet light, invisible to the naked eye, to capture high-quality images of Earth.
 - **Dr. Patricia Bath** In 1981, Dr. Bath began working on her most well-known invention: the Laserphaco Probe. Harnessing laser technology, the device created a less painful and more precise treatment of cataracts. She received a patent for the device in 1988, becoming the first African American female doctor to receive a patent for a medical purpose. With her Laserphaco Probe, Dr. Bath was able to help restore the sight of individuals who had been blind for more than 30 years.
 - **Granville T. Woods** Granville T. Woods was a prominent inventor and electrical engineer who developed over 50 significant patents over the course of his life. In 1887, Woods developed the first of his inventions, the Synchronous Multiplex Railway Telegraph which allowed communication between moving trains and train depots. One year later he developed a system for overhead electric conducting which helped power locomotives.
