- <u>Saint for the Week</u>: <u>Saint Frances of Rome</u>. As we continue our yearlong study of "Our Friends in High Places", this week our community celebrated the life of Saint Frances of Rome. The following offers a few highlights about her life:
 - Born in 1384, to a wealthy, noble family, Frances was 11 when she knew what God wanted for her – she was going to be a nun. However, her father promised her hand in marriage to Lorenzo Ponziani and at the age 13, she married Lorenzo.
 - Although married, Frances devoted her life to the Lord and to the needs of others: she faithfully attended Mass, visited prisons, cared for the sick in hospitals and much more.
 - With her husband's support, Frances started a lay order of women attached to the Benedictines, called the Oblates of Mary. They pledged to offer themselves to God and serve the poor.
 - When her husband passed, Frances moved into the house with the Oblates and was made the superior.
 - Her feast day is March 9 and serves as the patron saint of motorists.

• <u>Women's History Month</u>: As we continue celebrate Women's History Month, this week we highlighted the Rosa Parks, Susan B. Anthony, Jeannette Rankin and Dorothy Reed Mendenhall. In addition, we offered a "this day in Women's History" fact (<u>https://todayinwomenshistory.org/</u>). Here are the informational facts we shared this week:

- <u>March 8</u>: International Women's Day is held each year on this day. Its origins trace back to protests in the U.S. and Europe to honor and fight for the political rights for working women.
- <u>March 9</u>: Graciela Olivárez, Chicana activist, was born today in 1928. She was the first woman and first Latina graduate from Notre Dame Law School, and one of first two women on the board of Mexican American Legal Defense and Education Fund.
- <u>March 10</u>: Josephine Groves Holloway was born today in 1898. She founded the first unofficial Girl Scout troop for African American girls and worked for two decades to have her troops recognized by the Nashville Girl Scout Council.
- <u>March 11</u>: Lorraine Hansberry's A Raisin In the Sun opened at Barrymore Theater, New York. This was the first play by a Black woman to premiere on Broadway.
- <u>March 12</u>: Juliette Gordon Low assembled 18 girls together in Savannah, Georgia, for the first-ever Girl Scout meeting today in 1912.
