FAITH FORMATION

- <u>Saint for the Week</u>: <u>Saint Clement Mary of Hofbauer</u>. As we continue our yearlong study of "Our Friends in High Places", this week our community celebrated the life of Saint Clement Mary Hofbauer. The following offers a few highlights about his life:
 - John, the name given him at Baptism, was born in Moravia into a poor family, the ninth of twelve children.
 - he longed to be a priest, there was no money for studies, and he was apprenticed to a baker. This skill allowed him to find work in the bakery of a monastery where he was allowed to attend classes in its Latin school.
 - He was financially sponsored by a local affluent family to attend seminary studies. And as part of his program, he went to Rome and became drawn to Saint Alphonsus' vision of religious life and the Redemptorists order.
 - He would eventually make his way to Warsaw, Poland where he would be given the church of St. Benno. For the next nine years he preached five sermons a day, two in German and three in Polish, converting many to the faith.
 - He would spend his final 12 years of his life in Vienna, where he quickly became "the apostle of Vienna," hearing the confessions of the rich and the poor, visiting the sick, acting as a counselor to the powerful and sharing his holiness with all in the city.
 - $\circ~$ He was canonized in 1909 and his feast is celebrated on March 15.

- <u>Women's History Month</u>: As we continue celebrate Women's History Month, this week we offered "this day in Women's History" information of which highlighted the life and achievements of Ruth Ginsberg, Eveline Burns, Loretta Perfectus Walsh, Unita Blackwell and Margaret Foley (<u>https://todayinwomenshistory.org/</u>). Here is a brief description on each historical figure we featured this week:

- <u>March 15</u>: *Ruth Bader Ginsburg, the second female U.S. Supreme Court Justice, was born on this day in 1933.*
- <u>March 16</u>: Eveline Burns, an economist and technical expert, was born on this day in 1900. An immigrant to the U.S., she helped design social security and wrote "The American Social Security System," the standard text in this field.
- <u>March 17</u>: Loretta Perfectus Walsh became the first woman to join the Navy and the first woman to officially join the military in a role other than a nurse. She was born today in 1917.
- <u>March 18</u>: Unita Blackwell, a civil rights activist and the first black woman mayor elected in Mississippi, was born in Lula, Mississippi, on this day in 1933.
- <u>March 19</u>: Margaret Foley, a labor organizer, suffragist, and social worker, was born on this day in 1875. As a passionate suffrage activist, she would loudly confront anti-suffrage politicians at speaking engagements.
