FAITH FORMATION

- <u>Saint for the Week</u>: <u>Saint Gianna Beretta Molla</u>. As we continue our yearlong study of "Our Friends in High Places", this week our community celebrated the life of Saint Gianna Beretta Molla. The following offers a few highlights about her life:
 - o Gianna born in Magenta, Italy in 1922 as the 10th of the thirteen children
 - Gianna would go on to study medicine, and in 1949 graduated from the University of Pavia with degrees in medicine and surgery.
 - Gianna would later open a medical clinic, where she gave special attention to mothers, babies, and the elderly.
 - Although she originally felt drawn to serve as a missionary in South America,
 Gianna discerned that the Lord was calling her to the vocation of marriage.
 - Early in her pregnancy with her fourth child, doctors discovered that Gianna had developed a fibroma, a type of tumor, on the wall of her uterus. They advised that she either remove the tumor and have an abortion or have a total hysterectomy, which would also result in the death of her unborn child.
 - Gianna decided that they would have the tumor removed and try to carry her child to term. This decision put Gianna's own health at risk.
 - On April 21, 1962, Gianna gave birth to a beautiful, healthy little girl, named Gianna Emmanuela. Unfortunately, her birth marked the beginning of a week of extreme pain for Gianna, who passed away on Easter Saturday April 28, 1962.
 - o Gianna's husband Pietro and her children were present when Pope John Paul II canonized Gianna on May 16, 2004.
