FAITH FORMATION

• "Saint for the Week": St. Pius Pietrelcina was a Capuchin Franciscan priest, often referred to as Friars. Padre Pio (as he became affectionately known) who lived a life of extreme poverty, strictness and simpleness. During his early years as a Friar, he was drafted during World War I and served in the Italian Army as a member of the medical corps. He is often remembered for the stigmata he had on his hands (physical markings that correspond to those that were left on Jesus' body after his crucifixion). He serves as the patron saint for adolescents and for stress relief and his feast day is celebrated on September 23.
