 **FAITH FORMATION**

- **“Saint for the Week”:** **Saint Marguerite Bourgeoys.** St. Marguerite Bourgeoys was born in 1620 in France to a middle-class family. As a young lady, Marguerite joined a cloistered religious community of sisters, called the Congregation of Notre Dame. In 1653, Marguerite decided to travel to New France as a missionary and serve the poor and native peoples of the new colony. Marguerite’s work inspired a significant number of young women to help with her work and they assembled into a community. And although non-cloistered religious sisters were a rare thing in the seventeenth-century Church, Marguerite fought for an active status for her community so that they could continue to live among settlers and reach out to people of all walks of life. Marguerite's determination paid off and her Sisters of Notre Dame became known as “secular sisters.” As the colony of New France grew, so did the educational needs of its people, and Marguerite and her community responded by building schools for both settlers and native people. In fact, Marguerite is credited for beginning the first public school in Montreal. In their struggles to meet the needs of the people, the Sisters of Notre Dame encountered many obstacles. Yet though through it all, Marguerite led her community with courage and faith in God's providence. St. Marguerite died in 1700 and was canonized in 1982 as Canada’s first female saint. Her feast day is January 12 and she serves as the patron saint for orphans.

- **Monday, January 18 – NO SCHOOL:** As a reminder, school is closed on Monday, January 18 in observance of Dr. Martin Luther King Day.

UPDATES & REMINDERS

- **Holiday Weekend Travel:** As a reminder, any family travel outside of the bordering areas of Maryland (Delaware, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia and Washington, D.C.) requires that a student take a PCR test and submit the results to our school nurse, Christine Bauer at health@stursula.org before returning to campus. If a family elects not to have a PCR test, the student must remain in quarantine for 10 days.
- **Enrollment Registration:** Yesterday families received a letter regarding the School Board approved tuition rates for the 2021-2022 school year and today you received an email through School Admin with a link for the enrollment checklist. Please note that all returning families are asked to complete the re-enrollment process by Friday, January 29. Our retainment goal for current families is 92%. Help us achieve that goal by completing your contract and required forms today! And as a reminder, a student is not enrolled unless the family has completed a FACTS account. This step must be completed each year.
