"Saint for the Week": Saint John Bosco. Giovanni Melchiorre Bosco was born in Becchi, Italy, on August 16, 1815. Although John lost his father at the age of two, John was raised by a deeply devout mother in a house filled with love. As a youngster, John was encouraged by a priest to enter the seminary. As an ordained priest, Fr. John Bosco would be known for his ability to handle the most difficult of young men who were often poor and without a home. For this reason, John would eventually be able to acquire a house for himself and 40 boys. And in the first six years, the number of boys at the house grew to 150. John Bosco gave a father's care to rowdy, neglected boys. For this reason, John was known as the "friend of boys" and is often called Don, which means Father. Included as part of their education, Don Bosco would train the boys to be shoemakers and tailors. His schools and homes also offered the boys, in addition to getting a religious education, the opportunity to learn to play musical instruments, perform in plays, and engage in sports. During the second half of his life in ministry, John would begin a religious community of priests which is still active today. Because John admired Francis de Sales, he named the group the Salesians. And as he also wanted to help the young girls who were also neglected, he and St. Mary Mazzarello began a community of Sisters called the Daughters of Mary, Help of Christians. At the end of his life after decades dedicated to the needs of young people, the testimony to his ministry was evident by the 40,000 people who came to his wake when he died in 1888. He is recognized as the patron saint of the youth, editors and magicians. His feast day is this Sunday, January 31.
