# FAITH FORMATION

"Saint for the Week": Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton. If you were to ask who was the first person born in the United States to be declared a saint? Who opened the first American Catholic parish school and established the first American Catholic orphanage? Who founded the first native American religious community of women? The answers to all these questions would be the same: Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton. Elizabeth was born to an affluent family in New York in 1774. At the age of nineteen she married William Seton and would end up having five children-three girls and two boys. When Will Seton passed away, Elizabeth finally realized that God was calling her and her children to become Catholics. After Will's death, Elizabeth opened a Catholic boarding school for girls in Maryland as a means in which to support her and her children. As women from all over came to help Elizabeth, the school grew. And soon it seemed obvious that God was asking Elizabeth to dedicate her life completely to him. She and the other women began a community of religious women known as the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph's. Nearly 30 years after her death, the Sisters of Charity of Saint Joseph's joined the Daughters of Charity of Saint Vincent de Paul. Today thousands of Daughters of Charity carry on Elizabeth's work by serving in hospitals, homes for the aged and schools. Her feast day is on January 4 and she is recognized as the patron saint for Catholic schools and widows.

  - o Select what kind of notifications you want to receive via email
  - Select grades and attendance
  - At the bottom you will select frequency and choose how often you want to receive the notifications.
    - You may choose weekly but there is also an option to get it daily, every 2 weeks or monthly.
  - o An email will be sent to the address on file in powers schools.
