FAITH FORMATION

- <u>"Saint for the Week"</u>: <u>Saint Teresa of Ávila</u> was born in Ávila, Spain as Teresa de Cepeda y Ahumada and lived from 1515-1582. She joined the Spanish Carmelite order of nuns and would become one of the great mystics and religious women of the Roman Catholic Church, and the author of spiritual classics. St. Teresa was elevated to doctor of the church in 1970 by Pope Paul VI, and became one of the first two women to be so honored (Saint Catherine of Siena was the other).
- Harvest Mass: Next Sunday, October 25, the St. Ursula School, homeschool, and religious education communities will gather together with all our parishioners to honor the Feast of St. Ursula, and celebrate the Lord in the Eucharist. As this will be an outdoor Mass, please bring your own chairs. And for your reference, face mask coverings are required when processing to receive Holy Communion. We appreciate your at home assistance with the following N.U.T. Day guidelines:

However, they are not permitted to wear: jean shorts, baggy jeans, sweat pants, yoga pants, clothing that is unhemmed or torn, tight clothing, tank tops, halter tops, bare midriffs, sheer clothing, hats of any types, flip, flops, crocs, wedges, heels, and open back sandals, short skirts, sleeveless shirts, etc. In addition, sayings and pictures on shirts must not contain inappropriate language or advertisements. Leggings may be worn <u>if</u> <u>accompanied by a tunic top</u>. Also, please note that although sweatpants are not permitted, loose fitting team warm-up pants are permitted.
