"Aspire not to have more, but to be more." Saint Oscar Romero

(FAITH FORMATION

- <u>Saint for the Week</u>: <u>Saint Oscar Romero</u>. As we continue our yearlong study of "Our Friends in High Places", this week our community celebrated the life of Saint Óscar Romero. The following offers a few highlights about his life:
 - Óscar Arnulfo Romero y Galdámez was born in 1917 in a small town of El Salvador known as Ciudad Barrios. From an early age Óscar knew he wanted to be a priest.
 - He was ordained a priest for the Diocese of San Salvador in 1942 and by 1967, he would become Bishop of Santiago de Maria.
 - Bishop Romero was horrified by the military actions of the government on the poorest and most vulnerable of his community. In response to the senseless killing, he spoke out against the government and in support of human rights.
 - When he became Archbishop of San Salvador, the nation's capital, the government began to turn on the Catholic Church, arresting and killing priests and others who protested against the leadership. The government closed Catholic schools, and priests and teachers of religion were tortured and killed. Even possessing a Bible or a hymnbook became illegal.
 - Archbishop Romero became the target of the Salvadoran government's anger. As a result, on March 24, 1980, he was gunned down by an unknown assassin while celebrating Mass in a small hospital chapel.
 - More than 250,000 Salvadorans attended his funeral.
 - In 2015, Pope Francis declared Archbishop Romero a martyr. And in 2018, the Church formally canonized him as a saint of the Church.

- <u>Women's History Month</u>: As we continue celebrate Women's History Month, this week we offered "this day in Women's History" information of which highlighted the life and achievements of Sandra Day O'Connor, Gloria Steinem, Matilda Joslyn Gage, Florence Ellinwood Allen and Tara Lipinski (<u>https://todayinwomenshistory.org/</u>). Here is a brief description on each historical figures/events we featured this week:
 - <u>March 22</u>: On this day in 1997, Tara Lipinski, became the youngest women's World Figure Skating Champion. She was just 14 years and 9 months old.
 - <u>March 23</u>: Florence Ellinwood Allen, the first woman to serve on a state supreme court and one of the first two women to serve as a United States federal judge, was born on this day in 1884.
 - <u>March 24</u>: Matilda Joslyn Gage, a suffragist, and women's rights and Native American rights activist, was born on this day in 1826. She was a founding member of the National Woman Suffrage Association.
 - <u>March 25</u>: Gloria Steinem, women's rights activist, organizer, and journalist, was born today in 1934. She was the founding editor of Ms. Magazine, and also helped found National Women's Political Caucus, the Women's Action Alliance, and the Coalition of Labor Union Women.
 - <u>March 26</u>: Sandra Day O'Connor, the first woman U.S. Supreme Court Justice, was born today in 1930.
