FAITH FORMATION

- <u>Saint for the Week</u>: <u>Saint Catherine of Sienna</u>. As we continue our yearlong study of "Our Friends in High Places", this week our community celebrated the life of Saint Catherine of Sienna. The following offers a few highlights about her life:
 - o Catherine was born on March 25, 1347 in Siena, Italy.
 - Her parents had a total of 25 children (although a number of them died young).
 - At the age of 7, Catherine received a vision of Jesus and many of the popular saints of that time period.
 - o Inspired by a vision of St. Dominic, Catherine entered the female branch of the Third Order Dominicans known as Mantellate.
 - When Catherine was 21 years old, she had an experience which she described as her mystical union to Jesus.
 - In her mid-20s, Catherine entered into a state which allowed her to dialogue with God. As she was illiterate, Catherine's sisters relayed the dialogue which her religious sisters then recorded.
 - o By 1370 the full treatise was completed, and this compilation of over 400 letters is known as *The Dialogue with Divine Providence*.
 - o Catherine was canonized in 1461 by Pope Pius II.
 - Her feast day is April 29 and she is recognized as the Patroness of Rome and the Co-Patron of.
 - o In 1970, Pope Paul VI declared St. Catherine a Doctor of the Church.
- <u>Weekly Mass</u>: The prayer partner groups of 2A, 4A, 6B and 8B are scheduled to attend the 10:15am Mass on Tuesday, May 4. Although parents and other guests are not able to attend our Eucharistic celebration, please know that we welcome your attendance by joining us via our parish <u>FACEBOOK LIVE STREAMING</u> of the Mass.

- **RESCHEDULED Crowning of Mary May 10:** Due to the likelihood of inclement weather on Monday, we are rescheduling our Crowning of Mary prayer service to Monday, May 10 (with a rain date of May 11). For this event, **we are asking each student to bring in a single flower or small bouquet of flowers to school on 5/10.** The students will place their flower gift around the statue of Mary in front of the St. Ursula Church. Following this schoolwide procession, we will then move to the parking lot area behind the Spiritual Center entrance for a Rosary prayer service. Please know that families will be able to virtually attend this memorable event through our *Facebook Live* streaming service.
- Honoring Mary in May: As we honor the Blessed Mother throughout the month of May, we invite students to bring in flowers that will adorn the statue of Mary. The students may place the garden picked or store-bought flowers around our Heavenly Queen that will be positioned on a table that will be located outside by the auditorium entrance (except on rainy mornings). Ave Maria!
- Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration: On May 31, 2021, the Basilica of the Assumption, America's First Catholic Cathedral, will celebrate its 200th Anniversary and kick-off a year of events. To commemorate this historic day, Archbishop Lori will bless the new Perpetual Eucharistic Chapel in the Undercroft—which will be named after Pope Saint John Paul II. Inside the chapel, you find the chasuble he wore when he celebrated Mass at Camden Yards, the kneeler he knelt upon when he visited the Basilica in 1995 and a first-class relic—which you can venerate yourself. Also on May 31, the Basilica will begin Perpetual Adoration for the first time in Baltimore City's history. Think about committing to a weekly hour of adoration at America's First Cathedral. UPDATES & REMINDERS

- 2021-2022 Instructional Fee Update: Next week you will receive the INSTRUCTIONAL FEE STATEMENT through your 2021-22 FACTS account. Please note that payment is due by May 31.
- Academic Remediation Policy: For those students whose current end of the year grade sits at a failing mark, their families have received an emailed letter regarding the details of the anticipated summer remediation program that will be required of them. However, it is important to note that this policy applies to all students even those who are currently passing but would end up receiving an "E" as an end of the year grade in any of our core subject areas. With this being said, if the end of the year Progress Report card represents a grade of an "E" for the year, then the student will not have met the expected goals and standards for their current grade level. Therefore, they would be required to successfully complete a school approved summer remediation program.

For your reference, the required hours per subject area are as follows:

- ➤ ELA 15 hours; Math 15 hours
- ➤ Social Studies 10 hours; Science 10 hours; Religion 10 hours
- ➤ Spanish 5 hours

In addition to the completion of compulsory hours, the remediation policy will also require: 1) a time log; 2) the submission of a portfolio of work; 3) a course grade (in the case of a structured summer school program).

If a student earns an "E" for an end of the year grade and does not successfully remediate that course/subject area in the summer (as specified by the school), the child will be academically ineligible to return to St. Ursula School for the 2021-2022 school year or they will be retained at their current grade level.
