The report can be handwritten on the graphic organizer or type the requested information on a computer and print out. Use this paper as a checklist to make sure you don't forget a part of the report.

goal/problem/ conflict
Major Events in Sequential order (order they happened in the story)
Genre
Ending Resolution-how does the story end?
