# Summer Reading Report Entering Grade 5 2021-2022

Before starting the report, ask yourself: Did I choose a book from the correct list, list A? Points will be deducted if you do not choose a book on your reading level.

This is a list of what is needed on the summer book report; the report you complete at home and give to the 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher when you return to school in the fall. The report can be handwritten on loose leaf paper or typed on a computer and printed out. Use this paper as a checklist to make sure you don't forget a part of the report. Put the items on your paper in the following order:

	_ your first and last name
	_ the date you finished the report
	_ book title (appropriate capital letters & <b>underlined</b> )
	_ author(s)
	_ illustrator (If there isn't an illustrator write or type "no illustrator".)
here	_ main characters including a description (If they are only mentioned once or twice, don't include them
	setting ( <u>when</u> – 1920s, 3 years ago, in the present, etc. & <u>where</u> – Maryland, character's neighborhood, apartment in New York, etc.)
	_ plot (story summary – an introduction, the main problem or idea of the story, several of the events, the ending)
	opinion – Did you like the book? Why? You need to give at least one example from the book. Example 1 I liked this book because I love adventure stories. Tom ran away from home, built a raft and floated down the river. Along the way he had to find his own food and try to hide from the wild animals. Example 2: I thought this book was boring. It was not as exciting as I thought it would be. I got tired of reading about Tom getting in trouble all of the time.
