Pray with us... Fast with us... Give alms and change lives with us...

ENT is forty days of preparation for Easter. During Lent, we are encouraged to participate in three actions: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. In these three ways, we grow closer to God, to our brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ and become more the persons God has created us to be.

Prayer is conversing with God. Conversation is two-sided: talking and listening. In prayer, we "place ourselves in the presence of God" and we deepen our awareness that we are loved by our good God. How do you pour out your heart and mind to God? How do you make space to listen to God?

Fasting is deliberately denying ourselves something—usually food. Many of us were taught to "give up" something for Lent. Why go without food and feel hungry? It is a practice that puts us in solidarity with our brothers and sisters who experience hunger every day. Fasting helps us recognize all that we have been given. Fasting also can involve actions and attitudes. We can fast from material goods, from attitudes or practices that hurt our relationship with God, others and self. Fasting can deepen our desires and hunger for God. Fasting helps us to become better persons in God's creation.

Almsgiving means giving something freely (time, talent, money) to relieve the suffering of people living in poverty. Almsgiving is a response that flows naturally from prayer and fasting. We realize and accept our responsibility as members of the Body of Christ to respond to the needs of our brothers and sisters. To give alms is an expression of our gratitude for all that our good God has given us. With our almsgiving, we take the resources we did not use because of our fast and freely give them to our brothers and sisters in need. Almsgiving makes real our experience of God's goodness and love.

It was great to see so many families of the school and parish at the Spaghetti Dinner on Sunday. The event was fantastic and such a fun way to spend the day with our St. Ursula community. Thank you everyone who attended and volunteered. Thank you PHSA for organizing the event!

HEALTH REMINDERS

Please be reminded that if your child has any of these symptoms, we recommend that you check in with your physician to make sure that they are not contagious.

- Fever students need to be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school
- Sore throat
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea

- Skin infections, such as ringworm, all lesions need to be covered
- Pinkeye diagnosed students need to be on antibiotics for full 24 hours before returning to school
