Dear Parents,

Let me begin by thanking you for your support all school year. Your child's success this year is directly related to the open lines of communication between home and school. With this said, there are many important "tidbits" of information in this newsletter.

First, please note that dismissal time for the 2017-2018 school year will again be 5 minutes later. We will dismiss at 2:50 instead of 2:45. This allows for more time in the morning for homeroom especially on the middle school level. Also remember that school will reopen after Labor Day this year. Only Tuesday, September 5<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday, September 6<sup>th</sup> will be early dismissal (12:10). Thursday and Friday, September 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> will be full day sessions. Extended Day begins on Thursday, September 7<sup>th</sup>.

Both PK and Kindergarten will have gradual entrances. PK will attend one assigned day the week of September 5<sup>th</sup> with all students attending on Monday, September 11<sup>th</sup>. Kindergarten will have gradual entrance on Tuesday, September 5<sup>th</sup> with all students attending on Wednesday, September 6<sup>th</sup>. You will receive a letter in the mail in August with the specific date and time.

Progress reports for grades 1-7 will be distributed on June 9<sup>th</sup>. No progress report will be mailed home, so if for some reason your child is not in school June 9<sup>th</sup>, please stop by the school office to retrieve the report. Progress reports will not be given if any outstanding debt is unpaid by June 9<sup>th</sup>.

Book report information was sent home previously. By now we hope you have sent back your child's preference of books for students entering grades 6-8. Please refer to the deadlines on the forms.

We also will be posting school supply lists on the website no later than the close of school, June 9<sup>th</sup>. This will enable you to take advantage of all the back to school sales which begin the end of June!

BOOST applications are being accepted now through June 15<sup>th</sup>. Information is found on the website. According to the BOOST site, no late applications will be accepted. If you received BOOST money this year, you still must reapply by June 15<sup>th</sup>.
