- Do not "friend" people you do not know.
- Deleting something on social media doesn't mean it's gone! What you
 post stays in a database for at least seven years.
- Cyberbullying is real—and it's against the law (Grace's Law).
- Social media has GPS tracking that others can see and use to track your location.

- Apps are always listening.
- When an app updates, all features are automatically restored. You must update your privacy settings again.
- Be aware of what you share!
- Talk to a trusted adult whenever you need help or have questions or concerns.


